

Feodora and Gino have received bubbles from Gino's sister, Maria.


At the edge of the stream, they want to blow the biggest bubbles.

Feodora makes an especially big one.


Oh, how it sparkles in the sun!

He calls, "Come on, Feodora! You have to catch them!"


Excitedly, the dino-girl runs after the bubbles.

She stretches her head high into the air.


There, she catches one!

She says, "Look, that's a cocoon! A butterfly is just about to hatch!"


The children are amazed.

Gino says, "Look how hard it's trying!"


Feodora says, "There! It's almost done! I'm so excited to see what it looks like."

She loves little crawlers.


That's why she knows so much about them.

Suddenly, the butterfly spreads its wings in all their glory.


Both children are amazed.

They are speechless, she is so beautiful.


When Gino finds his voice again, he says in awe, "Bella! That's Italian and means 'Beauty'."

Gino says, "Bella looks like a queen."


Feodora replies, "You're right! She is the queen of butterflies!"

The butterfly girl becomes shy.


She gets bright red cheeks.
