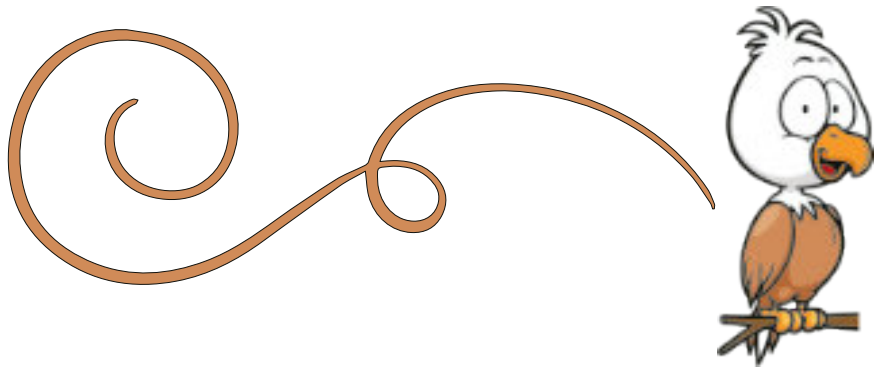

Gino fights against the giants to save Feodora.

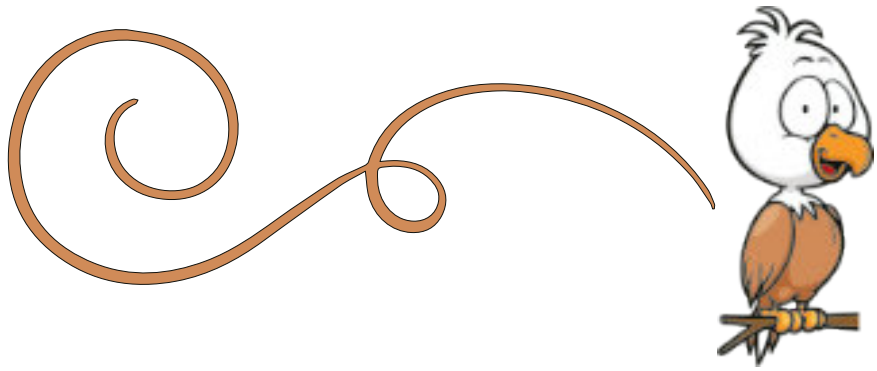
That's why he's carrying his sword and his telescope.

When they arrive at the meadow, Gino immediately begins to fight.

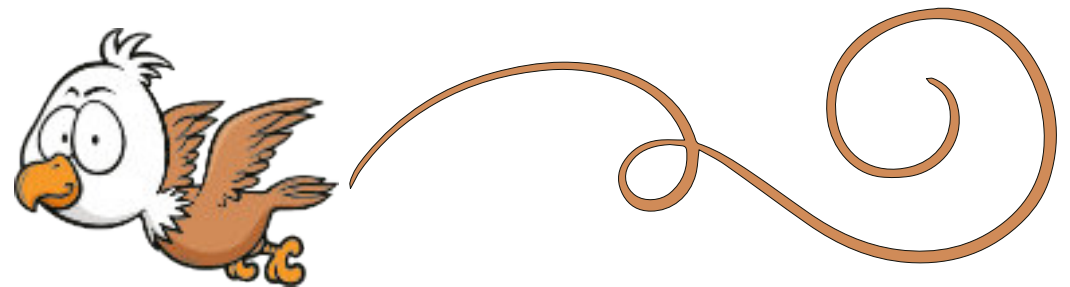
He swings his toy sword at a thick tree.

He calls out loudly, "Take that, evil giant! And this! I'm here to rescue my beloved Felicitas!"

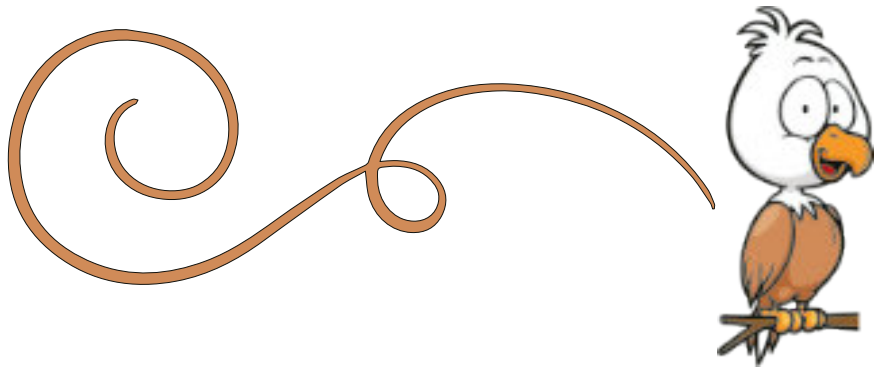
While he wildly waves his sword, he notices something.

Feodora sits on a hill by a tree.

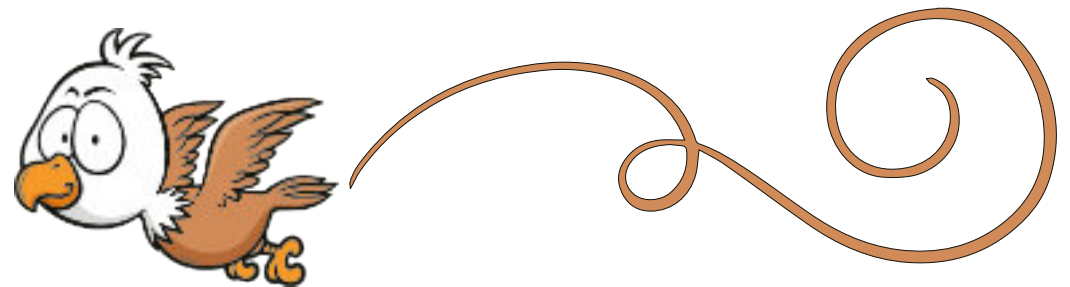
She pretends to be tied up.

From afar, she sees that Gino has stopped fighting.

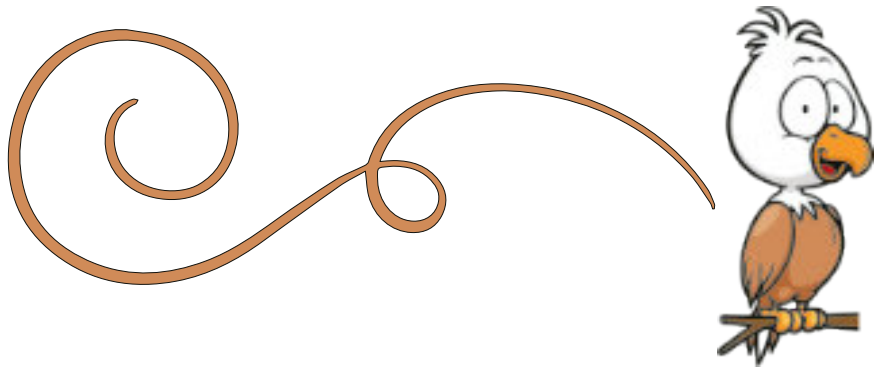
She calls out angrily, "GIII-NO! You have to rescue me! Where are you?"

Then he runs over to Feodora.





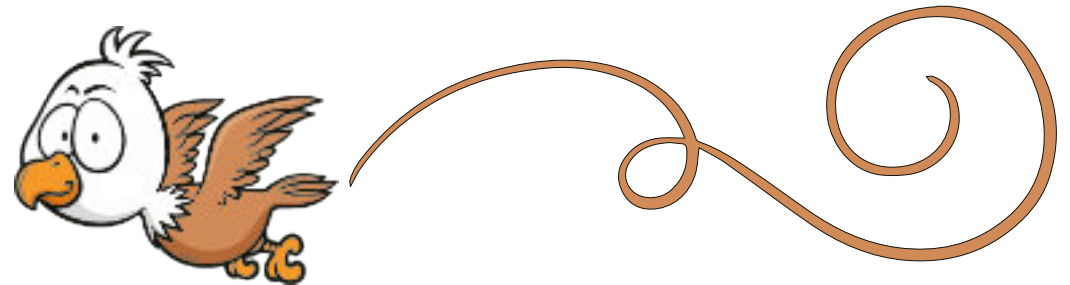


When Gino reaches Feodora, he immediately starts talking.

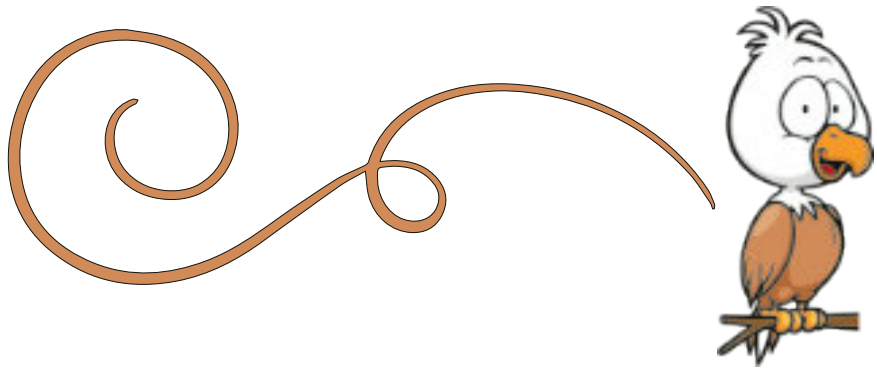
“Feodora! There’s a little bird in the tree. Something’s wrong with him!”

The children run to the tree.

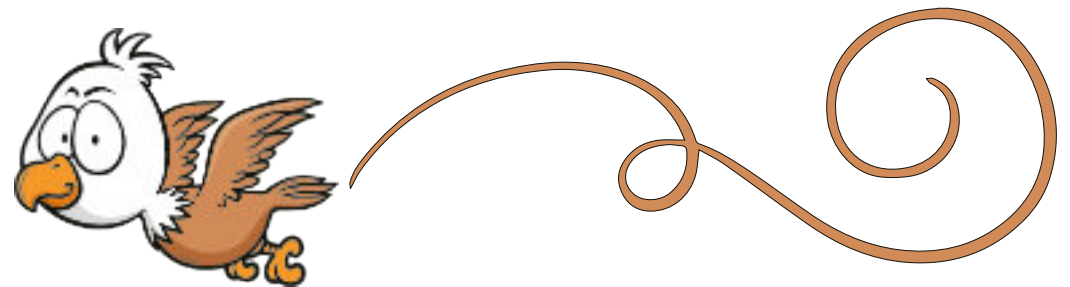
When Feodora sees the bird, she says, "Oh! It's a little sea eagle!

Gino holds a finger to his lips.

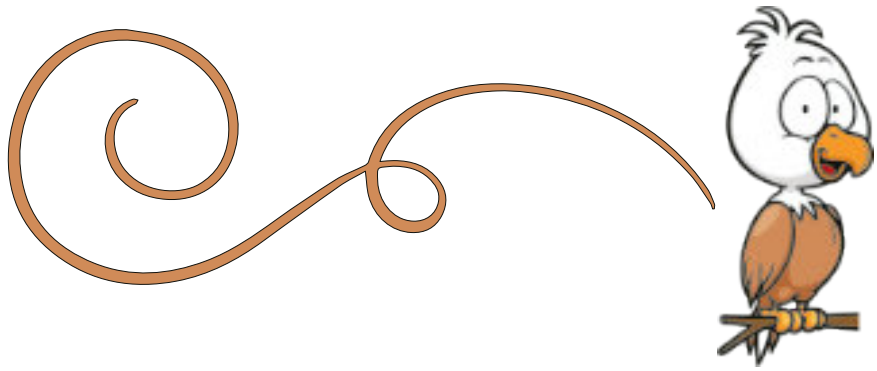
"Pssst! Listen! What's that sound?"

The children look around.

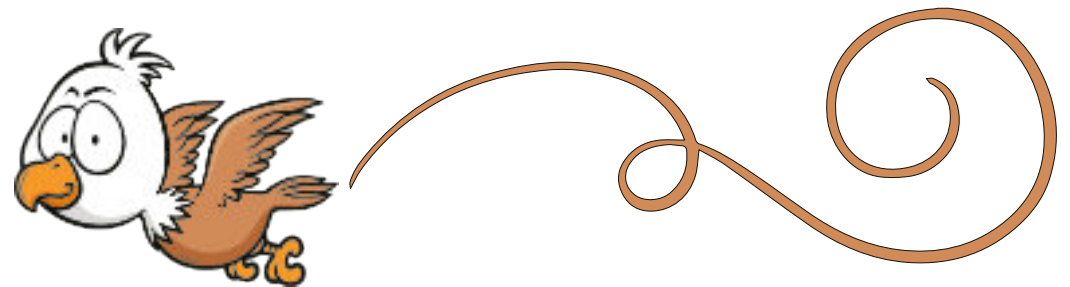
There it is again! The creepy noise!

Feodora points at the bird.

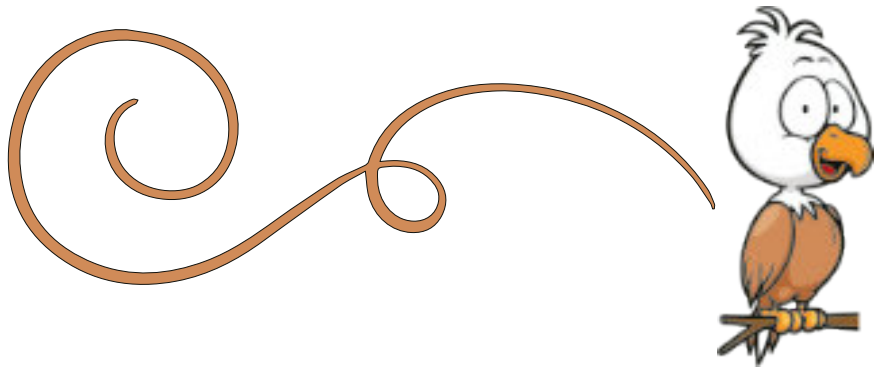
She says, "I think it's his stomach. It's growling!"
